

## **TERRY BIALKOWSKI WINS \$2,500 FIRST PRIZE IN MDUSBC SENIOR MASTERS AT WOODHAVEN LANES**

Terry Bialkowski of Windsor beat three-time Senior Masters champion Harry Sullins of Chesterfield 371-328 in the two-game title match to win the MDUSBC Senior Masters title at Woodhaven Lanes in Woodhaven and take home the top prize of \$2,500.

Bialkowski qualified 21<sup>st</sup> with a six-game total of 1,242. In match play he stayed undefeated with wins over Daniel Mayer Jr. of Waterford Township 375-356, Larry Franz of Redford 487-407, Mitchell Jabczenski Sr. of Novi 444-380, Richard Arpke of Clarkston 369-344 and Sullins the first time 388-357 to advance to the title match.

Bialkowski averaged 204.22 for 18 games of competition. While he had the lowest average of the top eight finishers, he rose to the occasion when he needed to. He finished second in the Super Senior competition last year. He and his wife had a trip planned to Florida on the final day of competition and contemplated forfeiting his matches due to the trip, but thankfully reconsidered.

Sullins qualified seventh with 1,293 for the six games. He stayed in the winner's bracket with victories over Edwin Peart of Southfield 469-369, Peter Kaczmarczyk of Warren 418-325, Kenneth Wyatt of Sterling Heights 468-407 and Richard Wayne of Westland 449-371 before falling to Bialkowski the first time 388-357. Once in the loser's bracket he triumphed over Joseph Krajenke of Clinton Township 492-438 for the opportunity to avenge the earlier loss to Bialkowski, but Bialkowski was too much. He settled for \$1,250 after averaging 213.7 for 20 games.

Krajenke, the 1999 Masters champion, qualified 17<sup>th</sup> with 1,249. He won his first two matches with wins over Leonard Kersten of Clarkston 425-406 and Gregory Cronce of Garden City 463-371 before falling into the loser's bracket with a loss to Richard Arpke 439-433. Once in the loser's bracket he dispatched Jeffrey Suma Sr. of Auburn Hills 417-404, Glenn Ludeman of Chesterfield 518-428, Richard Wayne 418-396, Jimmy Magolan of Shelby Township 465-413 before getting knocked out by Sullins 492-438. He took home \$750 and averaged a tournament high of 219.36.

After qualifying 27<sup>th</sup> with 1,226, Magolan beat Ronald Forton of St. Clair Shores 396-303 and Anthony Stipcak Jr. of Redford 424-376 before losing to Richard Wayne 465-323. Once in the loser's bracket he beat Edward Jachcinski of Macomb 412-353, Kenneth Wyatt 480-445 and Richard Arpke 477-383 before ending his tournament with a loss to Krajenke 465-413. He settled for \$600 after averaging 207.55 for 20 games.

Wayne finished fifth for \$500 and averaged 211.38.

Arpke ended up sixth, picking up \$500 after averaging 208.06.

Ludeman finished seventh, averaged 213.5 and cashed for \$400.

Wyatt took home \$400 for his eighth place finish, averaging 211.75.

Defending champion Glenn Pilon of Brownstown lost his first two matches taking home \$225.

John Watkins of Canton won the Super Senior competition for non-qualifiers 60 years of age and over. He defeated Douglas Evans Sr. of Hudson, Fla. 241-233 for the title. Watkins won \$200 for his efforts and Evans walked away with a check for \$175.
