SAMANTHA PERCHA AND TRE'VON TERRELL WIN MDUSBC JUNIOR MASTERS TITLES AT MAYFLOWER LANES

Tre'von Terrell of Detroit prevailed in the boy's division and Samantha Percha of Warren won the girl's division of the Metro Detroit USBC Junior Masters at Mayflower Lanes in Redford.

Terrell qualified first with a six-game total of 1,231. He beat Andrew Hudson of Brownstown in an exciting 56-27 roll off, after tying with 180 each. Hudson qualified third with 1,173.

Percha defeated top seed Sydney Allison of Ypsilanti 160-159 to win the girl's title. Percha qualified second with 1,062, while Allison's qualifying score was 1,092.

The boy's stepladder began with Ryan Beaty of Sterling Heights beating Gabriel Johnson of Canton 165-163 before falling to Hudson 206-169. Hudson then beat Cole Peters of Waterford 219-194 to advance to the championship match.

Jillian Lipinski of Macomb beat Casey Malmsten of Wayne 200-148 before Percha defeated Lipinski 183-178 on her way to the finals.

The event was a USBC Junior Gold qualifying event. Percha earned the girl's spot, while Terrell and Beaty earned the boy's spots.

A total of 72 youth bowlers participated in the scratch event, 56 boys and 16 girls.

The MDUSBC Junior Masters Tournament is a USBC certified event operated by the Metro Detroit USBC Association, the largest local association of the United States Bowling Congress.
