JULIA HUREN WINS WOMEN'S SERIES EVENT AT THUNDERBOWL LANES

Julia Huren of Westland won the Metro Detroit USBC (MDUSBC) Women's Series event Sunday with a 190-171 triumph over Kasey Eaton of Wyoming at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park. Huren took home the top prize of \$500, while Eaton settled for \$250.

Huren qualified first in the field of 20, with a four-game total of 820 on games of 184, 212, 201 and 223. In match play she beat Naomi Smith of Southfield 243-208 and Angela Wilt of Westland 236-162 to advance to the finals.

Eaton qualified third with 806 including a high game of 224. In match play, she triumphed over Natalie Miskiel of Toledo 203-168 and Chelsey Klingler of Grand Rapids 209-202 on her way to the championship match.

Stacey Timmer of Wayland retained her lead in the cup points list with 492 points, closely followed by Kasey Eaton (484) of Wyoming and Cathleen Maes (462) of Westland. The next event will be triple points at Century Bowl in Waterford on April 11.

After the competition Huren lost to Men's Series winner Aaron Lorincz of Center Line 246-204 in the Battle of the Series for \$100 "cold cash" and bragging rights. This gives the men a 4-3 advantage over the women in this extra competition.
